INDUCTION DAY CELEBRATIONS AT V.IIAS

Orientation program was conducted for first year students on 9 December 2020. It was conducted online on Google Meet, in two slots. The morning session, from 10 A.M.-12:45 P.M., was for B.Com students and the afternoon session 1P.M. - 3:30 P.M., was for BBA & B. Sc students.



The program started with prayer, rendered by Ms. Anugna from B. Com II year. The session was initiated by Dr. Rama, who gave the welcome address and the vignette of the college and acted as the anchor of the whole program.

The welcome address was followed by the Principal Dr. Aruna's address. INCULCATING VERSATILITY IN THE STUDENTS

Project based learning is a powerful teaching method that has extensive benefits for students ranging from critical thinking to project management to selfconfidence. Project work provides many opportunities to students to meet a variety of learning aims. It gives teachers the opportunity to build stronger relationships with their students by acting as their mentors. Students collaborate with others and learn



team work. The topics given were related to the Environment and Sustainable Development Goals(SDGs) to inculcate the habit of research and presenting original ideas in writing.

The students from all streams were divided into groups of 4.Each group is allotted a mentor to guide them in their respective topics. In this context, all the mentors were given training on how to guide their students by Ms.T. Radhika, Ms.B.V.Lakshmi, Ms. D.Sujatha and Dr. Shashidhar, members of the Project Committee in three sessions. The Director, Dr.Vijaya Prasad garu spoke about the SDGs and also about the importance of doing project work. The Framework of Inter Disciplinary Projects were designed and took shape under the guidance of Dr. Aruna, Principal, VJIAS.

FOURTH INDUSTRIAL REVOLUTION (4IR)

Today, we are at the cusp of the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4 IR) which is ushering in powerful technologies that are already helping us mitigate if not eliminate the calamities that are disrupting our lives. For example, machine learning-based models, trained on specific bio-molecules, have offered inexpensive and rapid implementation methods for the discovery of effective viral therapies and vaccines for Covid-19 that have effectively replaced the traditional tedious and manual trial and error methods. This has resulted in dramatically reducing the time for overall development of a vaccine



consisting of a discovery phase, a pre-clinical phase, the clinical development phase (phases I to III) and the post-licensure phase (phase IV) from 10 to 15 years to less than 15 months.

This does not, however, imply that the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR) technologies such as robotics, artificial intelligence, the internet of things, digitalization and automation will replace human intervention but they will certainly demand that people develop the right technology acumen in the new technology regime. According to the World Economic Forum, 4IR will merge physical, digital and biological worlds in ways that will fundamentally alter the way we work, live and relate to one another. The breadth, depth and speed of this revolution will significantly impact the development of countries and how organizations respond, create value and compete. It is, therefore, essential for people entering the workforce to understand, equip and update themselves continuously with skills that will help them to compete and succeed in the next industrial revolution. So, what exactly are the skills required for the 4IR?

According to a recent Deloitte Report on preparing tomorrow's workforce for the Fourth Industrial Revolution, there are essentially four categories of skills that one needs to be equipped with for the future.

The first category involves foundational skills such as time management, personal presentation, and attendance. These skills are the basic ingredients required for 'workforce readiness' and employability. Essential human skills commonly referred to as "soft skills" such as creativity, complex problem solving, relationship building, communication, emotional intelligence, and critical thinking form the second category. There will also be an increasing emphasis on "global competence" which is the ability to apply soft skills in crosscultural, multicultural, and global contexts in which organizations are operating.

Besides, courage, resiliency, adaptability, and resourcefulness are important traits that organizations will increasingly value and demand in the frontier technology era.

The third set is essentially industry-specific technical and management skills which are acquired mainly through work-based learning.

Finally, with the inevitable expansion of the 'gig economy' in which people move between formal and informal work and innovations such as co-working spaces and cloud platform for video and audio conferencing, chats, and webinars, opportunities for entrepreneurship will abound. Hence, those possessing entrepreneurial skills will be better placed to take advantage of future job opportunities.

With the relentless march of new technologies and with robots, AI-controlled gadgets and autonomous cars and such moving from the realm of science fiction movies into real life, it is quite natural for people to be apprehensive of a future scenario in which machines will make humans obsolete. This may be true to some extent. While domain expertise may be replaced by robots and AI, machines capable of performing creative tasks, however, seems implausible at least in the foreseeable future. What is, however, certain is that jobs will become more complex and the scope will change requiring continuous re-skilling and lifelong learning to succeed.

These changes will provide excellent opportunities for those who are willing to continuously learn new skills and stay ahead regardless of the challenges posed by the frontier technologies.

EDITORIAL

Education and Industrial Revolutions (IRs) impact each other. IR (1.0) took place around the year 1780 in England and was characterized by mechanization of productions using water and steam power and weaving looms. The IR (2.0) took place in America around the year 1870 which enabled mass production using Electrical Energy. The third IR (3.0) took place around the year 1969 in the field of Electronics and Information and Communication Technology (ICT). The IR (4.0) commenced a couple of decades later involving complex digitization technology (cyber physical systems).



It has a massive impact on people, education, jobs and skill

development. This has internet related developments, Robotics, Driverless Autonomous Vehicles, 3-D Printing, Quantum Computation, Nano Technology, Biotechnology, Artificial Intelligence and so on. The advancement of new technologies of IRs (4.0) blurs the lines between the physical, digital and biological worlds says Dr. D.N. Rao, President, Vignana Jyothi in his article "Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR)" presented in this issue.

Gurukul system was considered as Education (1.0) in the ancient days. Using teaching aids like Over Head Projectors (OHP), power point slides, transparencies and additional tools of teaching during the last Quarter of century is taken as Education (2.0). With the commencement of the 21st Century, newer ways became possible like Social Media, e-mails, Wikipedia, Blogs, Smart boards, Face book, Twitter and WhatsApp.

The integration of education with technology represents Education (3.0). Education (4.0) is a response to the needs of IR (4.0) where human being and technology are aligned to enable new possibilities.

Today, a single 'smart phone' with specific Apps in place can perform unimaginable multiple tasks like, Telephone, TV, Radio, Computer, Calculator, Organizer, GPS, Dictionary, Camera, torch, Mobile banking, online shopping, booking tours and hotels, accessing e-books, journals, online teaching and learning and so on with ease, comfort and speed all because of IR (3.0).

In reforming the education for 21st Century, Universities and Colleges must address the aspects of IR (4.0) and train the students to shoulder the responsibilities and emerge successful as creative thinkers, innovators and entrepreneurs.

The NEP-2020 perspectives on which wide discussions are going on across the country should keep track of these developments!



OBITUARY



Sri Cherukuri Venkateshwar Rao garu (84), popularly known as C. V. Rao, was a key and very important person in the formation of Vignana Jyothi. He was one of the founder members of Vignana Jyothi. He has contributed a lot in the establishment of and in sustaining all the institutions under Vignana Jyothi. His singular contribution is that he acted as the thread to unify the Philanthropists and educational sponsors in the establishment of Vignana Jyothi Society. His service to VJ as Secretary, CEO and Advisor right from the beginning till today is noteworthy and creditable.

C.V Rao garu worked in the Government sector before serving Vignana Jyothi. He worked as Lecturer in Chemistry at Giriraj Government Degree College, Nizamabad (1962) Gandhi Medical College (1964), Nagarjunasagar Engineering College which was a forerunner to JNTU (1965). He worked in various administrative positions as Secretary, Andhra Pradesh State Council of Higher Education (APSCHE), 'Director, Academics' at Dr.B.R.Ambedkar Open University, Hyderabad and as the Registrar, JNTU, Hyderabad. His absence was terribly felt in all the positions he vacated. "People connected to him have always felt that he was their man." His personal contacts with students coming from rural background in particular, as a mentor, made him dearer to thousands of students and parents.

C.V. Rao garu was one of the architects in the establishment of VJIAS and in its growth to promote liberal education. On behalf of VJIAS, the Chairman Sri Y. J. Venkata Rao garu, the Director, Principal, Vice-Principal, faculty, staff and students of VJIAS convey their profound grief and sorrow to the bereaved family at the sudden demise of Sri C. V. Rao garu. May the almighty provide strength and will power to the family members to overcome the tragedy.
