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National Seminar on "Language Teaching – Integrating Technology, Traditions, Customs and Values"

A one-day national seminar on "Language Teaching – Integrating Technology, Traditions, Customs and Values" was organized by the Department of Languages at VJIAS on February 28, 2025. The seminar aimed to create a platform for educators, scholars, and students to engage in meaningful discussions on how to blend modern technology with traditional language pedagogy while preserving cultural values. The event began with an inaugural session where Dr. T. Rama, Principal and Seminar Director, highlighted the urgent need to integrate technology thoughtfully into education. She emphasized that language classrooms are ideal spaces to instill essential human values such as empathy, respect, and social responsibility through storytelling, collaborative projects, and cultural references.



Dr. N. Aruna, Deputy Director, shared insights into the institution's growth and its mission to provide quality education from KG to PG without a profit motive.

Mr. V. Rajashekar, Chairman of VJIAS, appreciated the theme, relevance and expressed confidence in the faculty's commitment to holistic education. Prof. S.K. Mahamood, Vice-Chairman of TGCHE, congratulated the organizers and underscored the importance of increasing female participation in higher education. Dr. D.N.Rao, former president, VJ, gave a befitting message saying that we can learn from our ancient scriptures which are known for knowledge & wisdom. He appreciated the theme of the seminar and said that it was an apt one in the present scenario.



The plenary session featured keynote addresses by eminent scholars. Prof. Santosh Mahapatra from BITS Pilani spoke on the transformative impact of emerging technologies like AI, Cloud Computing, and Cyber Security, and stressed the importance of ethical practices and digital responsibility. Prof. W. Mayadevi, HoD, Department of Hindi, Osmania University delivered a compelling address in Hindi, discussing the importance of language in expressing not only ideas but live realities and emotions, especially in the context of Dalit literature. She emphasized the role of language in advocating equality and justice. Prof. Kamalakara Sharma, HoD, Department of Telugu, OU, speaking at the conference expressed that "Teaching a language like Telugu is not just about grammar and vocabulary-it is about passing on the cultural identity embedded in our literature, festivals, and oral traditions. In today's digital age, we have the unique opportunity to use technology to preserve and promote these cultural elements. By integrating values and traditions into language education, we ensure that students not only learn to speak the language but also learn to live the spirit of it." Addressing the audience with deep conviction, Prof. Vidyanand Arya, HoD, Sanskrit Dept., OU, emphasized the timeless significance of language in shaping human identity. He remarked that. "Languages carry the DNA of civilizations. When we teach a language, we are not just teaching words-we are transmitting a way of life. Integration of values, customs, and traditions in language education builds character and cultural consciousness. At the same time, technology must be seen as a bridge, not a barrier. It can revive ancient wisdom, bring texts to life, and connect learners across geographies. Our goal should be holistic education-where tradition meets transformation."



The valedictory session was graced by **Prof. Madhusudan Penna**, Director of the Sanskrit Academy, who highlighted the timeless connection between language, culture, and ancient Indian wisdom. He urged educators to draw from the philosophical and spiritual richness of traditions like the Vedas and Yoga to enhance modern language teaching, making it both intellectually and emotionally enriching.

The seminar concluded with reflections by Dr. T. Rama, who reinforced the message that while technology is omnipresent, it cannot replace the emotional and cultural depth that language provides. She stressed the role of educators and parents in shaping sensitive, value-oriented individuals through meaningful language education. Keynote speakers and session chairs were felicitated, best paper presenters were awarded, and participation certificates were distributed. The event was marked by enthusiastic participation, vibrant discussions, and a shared commitment to blending innovation with tradition in education, making the seminar a truly enriching and successful academic endeavor.

EDITORIAL

THE IMPACT OF THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION'S POLICIES ON INDIAN STUDENTS IN THE UNITED STATES

Indian students constitute a significant share of the international student community in the United States. According to the Open Doors 2024 report, India has emerged as the leading country of origin for international students in the U.S. during the 2023–2024 academic year, with 3,31,602 students — a remarkable 23 percent increase compared to the previous year.

Challenges Facing Indian Students

A decade ago, the United States was a preferred destination for Indian students seeking world-class education and promising career opportunities. The pathway from higher education to employment was relatively stable and encouraging. However, this positive environment began to shift during the previous tenure of the Trump administration.

Today, Indian students are facing numerous challenges, exacerbated by a global economic slowdown and, more critically, by the policies introduced by the Trump administration. Several new immigration and visa policies have been proposed or implemented with the intention of reducing the number of international students, under the assumption that it would enhance employment prospects for American citizens and contribute to the vision of "Making America Great Again."

Yet, there is growing concern that such measures could undermine the very fabric of America's educational and economic strength, both of which have historically benefited immensely from the contributions of international students, including those from India. As a result of these restrictive policies, many Indian students now find it difficult not only to sustain themselves academically and financially but even to survive in the U.S. under increasingly uncertain circumstances.

The Need for Responsible Policy Implementation

It is crucial at this juncture for the Government of India to intervene and engage diplomatically with U.S. authorities to ensure the safety and well-being of our students abroad.

While it is understandable that the U.S. government prioritizes the interests of its citizens, it is imperative that policies distinguish between existing students and new applicants. Students who are already enrolled in American institutions made life-altering decisions based on the policies and conditions prevailing at the time of their admission. Many have secured substantial education loans with repayment plans premised on the availability of employment opportunities and stable visa regulations.

Retroactively applying new, restrictive policies to these existing students would not only be unfair but could also leave them in severe financial distress, with limited means to repay their loans — loans often issued by financial institutions in both India and the United States.

Therefore, we urge that any new immigration or education-related policies be clearly communicated and implemented prospectively, affecting only new applicants who can make informed choices about their future under the updated rules. Students who are currently pursuing their education must be allowed to complete their academic and career journeys under the terms that were promised to them.

In protecting these students, we are not only safeguarding individual futures but also honoring the longstanding educational partnership between India and the United States — a partnership that has enriched both nations culturally, economically, and academically.
