




LPG GAS LEAKAGE INDICATOR: I PRIZE WINNER


A gas detector is a device that detects the presence of gases in an area, often as part

of a safety system. A gas detector can ring an alarm to operators in the area where the leakage occurs, alerting them to leave. This type of device is important because there are many gases that can be harmful to humans and animals when leakage occurs.



Gas detectors can be used to detect combustible, flammable and toxic gases, and oxygen depletion. This type of device is used widely in industry and can be found in locations, such as on oil rigs. They





may also be used in firefighting. Mainly this device is used in kitchens to detect the leakage of gas. The top order sensor used among the MQ series is MQ5 gas sensor which detects the gas as soon as the gas leaks.

EARTH QUAKE ALARM

Mr. Hemanth from B.Sc I year created an Earth quake Alarm. An earthquake detector or an earthquake alarm is a device that senses earthquakes and alerts people, so that they can move to safety. We can find a lot of earthquake detectors in a market. Some smart phone apps also exist for this purpose.



EVOLUTION OF MOBILE PHONES:

The first hand held cellular phone was demonstrated by Dr. Martin Cooper, who worked as an engineer at Motorola at that time. So, the first mobile was a 'Motorola'one developed in the year 1978. After a few more innovations they finally came up with smartphones. Smartphones were developed in the late 1990s.

Editorial:

National Service Scheme (NSS) was started in the year 1969 to build a sense of responsibility in students towards constructive social service with the motto of 'not me but you'. In 1977, the University Grants Commission (UGC) as a policy introduced 'Extension Education' also known as 'community outreach' in all colleges and Universities as a 'third dimension', the other two being Teaching and Research. Extension Education means the type of education that is stretched out into the villages/community beyond college education for which it is meant. The report of Kothari commission – 1964-66 emphasized the role of higher education to work on problems of society. It emphasized that educational institutions should come out to support society. NSS works by adopting villages and schools to serve the cause of society.

The significance of the decision to 'extend' the institutional services to the communities is due to the fact that better opportunities for development had not reached the wider sections of the society due to inequity and injustice. People are suffering from various problems like: low literacy, low income, gender disparities, health problems etc., Extension activities by the colleges help the needy community to work on their immediate problems or enable them to solve their own problems by themselves with limited resources. Extension services is a socially oriented activity that promotes the standard of living of the under privileged or those who need it.

Like 'Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), this is Institutional Social Responsibility (ISR). Today, the application of extension principles is not confined to rural areas only. It is equally applicable to the urban context. Colleges and Universities are a part of society. They are the resources of the society. It is the duty of the institutions to pay back to the society its dues. Also, it should be the obligation of the teaching community to give extension lectures to interpret recent trends in their fields to community and create technological awareness. Already, marks are proposed to the students for actively participating in NSS activity. The NSS program should be expanded and improved further to address the immediate needs of the society. VJIAS has two NSS Units, involving both boys and girls, to discharge our societal obligations.

In the last three months, all the faculty of Science Departments took the lead in promoting the students to organize a technology exhibition named as Informatique Exhib'IT' in early December. 17 teams participated. The Commerce Department organized a 'Commerce Expo' involving B.Com students in November. They made models on various Commerce related topics. 21 stalls were displayed. The Management Department organized on 'Ad-Making' Competition for all BBA students. 23 teams participated. Thusall students and departments are involved highlighting their creativity. The details are presented in this issue.








India Assumes G20 Leadership

G20 is a group of twenty big economies of the world, founded on 20th Sept 1999, to make a meaningful contribution to the global economy and to help in improving the geopolitical state of affairs of the world. G20 countries possess around 85% of the world's GDP, 75% of world trade and two thirds of the world population. The G20 comprises Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey, the U.K, the U.S. and the E.U.

India has been a member of G20 from its very inception. This group has a rotating presidency every year. This time, India assumed the presidency for 1 year on 1st Dec 2022 at the Bali session from the former president of Indonesia. The G20 group does not have a permanent secretariat, and the presidency is supported by the previous, current and future holders of the post, together called the troika. Along with India, 2023's troika includes Indonesia and Brazil. As a president-nation, India will host the 18th G20 Heads of State and Governments summit in December 2023 in New Delhi. The summit will mark an end to the series of meetings held over the course of the year. Tentative host cities for meetings between December 2022 and February 2023 include Bengaluru, Chandigarh, Chennai, Guwahati, Indore, Jodhpur, Khajuraho, Kolkata, Lucknow, Mumbai, Pune, Rann of Kutch, Surat, Thiruvananthapuram and Udaipur.

It is a proud moment for India to represent the leading economies of the world, and making their voice be heard to the world. Though India has been an active partner in many regional and sub-regional groups from the beginning, in the recent past the view of the world towards India has changed tremendously. For this there are many reasons like, the changed strategy of India in maintaining international relations, the way India exhibits its values, traditions, and culture to the world, daring steps taken in internal and external affairs (in combating the pandemic and helping neighbouring countries through vaccine supplies) and projecting it as a strong, bold nation, that can not only encounter the issues that come in its way butalso lead the world.

The witness for the above is the words of Mr. Joko Widodo, the Indonesian head of state and Govt. at the 2022, G20 Bali Summit, "Today I want to assure that, India's G20 presidency will be inclusive, ambitious, decisive and action oriented". In the Bali Summit conclusion, our Prime Minister, Sri Narendra Modi also remarked that, "together we make the G20 a catalyst for global change". Through G20 platform India wants to showcase its noble philosophies like *VasudhaivaKutumbakam* (one earth, one family, one future) and *LiFE*(Life Style for Environment) through the theme and the logo of the event.But itwon't be a cake walk for India to realize these words. Getting the consensus of member nations on many issues is very complicated. Every country has its own local priorities, which dominates the diplomacy. No country compromises on its national priorities. For exampleIndia's own problems with China- also a part of the G20 group, pose a potential issue for the effective functioning of the forum. However G20 is all about an emerging world order and includes all the major economies.

During its G20 Presidency, India can take up any issues that need to be addressed.
